

Shouts of joy to you all from our huge family here in the jungles of Borneo. We trust you are healthy and safe where-ever you are at this moment. Unfortunately our scheduled September newsletter didn't happen due to just being too busy, hence an early December newsletter will have to suffice. Many of us thought that 2020 was a year when the world went crazy due to the Corona pandemic, and that it couldn't possibly get any crazier than that, but how wrong we were.

This year saw a world go hyper crazy and afraid, as freedoms were suddenly stripped away and new scary, unprecedented rules and regulations were implemented, and often changed at a drop of a



hat. What bothers me most, and must have grieved the Lord, is that people started to forget how to care for one another. People were so afraid of catching the virus themselves (and sometimes understandably because they may have lost a loved one to the virus) that they forgot Jesus' commandment to "love your neighbor as you love yourself". But scripture tells me that Jesus always reached out to those in need, those that were considered by society as "unclean", "contaminated" or unwanted. He never shied away from anyone in need regardless of their situation. How is it then that so many Christians today, during this Corona crisis, are so fearful, and because of that, have become unconcerned for their "neighbor" or are upset or even angry with those that do help those who are in great need, or are angry with those who think and act differently than they do (e.g. vaccinated people or unvaccinated). We see long-term friendships now breaking up, even churches splitting because of differences of opinion and disagreements on how we should handle this crisis. Like I said before, it must grieve our Lord to see such disunity amongst Christians, fear and lack of love for one another. If we think that this crisis is already terrible and we react in such a manner, what are we going to be like when even worse things happen as the book of Revelations says it will?




Our Patan

It is good that we don't know exactly when Christ will return. If we knew the precise date, we might be tempted to be lazy in our work for Christ. Worse yet, we might plan to keep sinning and then turn to God right at the end. Heaven is not our only goal; we have work to do here. And we must keep on doing it until death or until we see the unmistakable return of our Savior.

With false teaching and loose morals comes a particularly destructive disease – the loss of true love for God and others. Sin cools our love for God and others by turning our focus on ourselves. We cannot truly love if we think only of ourselves.

“So don’t worry about these things, saying, ‘What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear? These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and He will give you everything you need. Mat 6:31-33

For almost an entire year, from the start of the Corona virus, when it ravaged throughout the world, our village was spared from infections even though around us in our region casualties started to mount up. Although we’ve put restrictions in place to minimize any transmission of the virus, we didn’t go overboard. We didn’t allow fear to be our focus but we kept our trust in God and continued to help those in need in our region as Jesus would have done. Our schools mostly remained open during the entire government lock downs while all other schools in the country were closed. What a blessing that was.

Finally the government made it mandatory for teachers to be vaccinated otherwise they were not allowed to teach anymore, so all our teachers were vaccinated. A few days later some of them started to get sick. It was at that time we believe that the virus entered our village.

Our Yolanda, a kidney patient who has peritoneal dialysis 4-5 times a day, started to get sick. She developed a fever, couldn’t keep food down (which is essential for a kidney patient), couldn’t sleep anymore and started to show some strange behavior as if she wasn’t registering things anymore. Eventually she fell into a coma. Toher (her husband) took her to the hospital where she was placed in isolation. Toher was the only person who was allowed to visit her only because none of the nursing staff knew how to perform the peritoneal dialysis. Her condition deteriorated as the days went by and eventually the doctor in charge advised Toher to go and get Yolanda’s clothes for her funeral as she wasn’t going to make it. As Toher went home, he informed his two children, our Marchell and Michelle of the oncoming predicament. Marchell immediately rebuked

the news and scolded his father for his lack of faith. At that very moment a prophetic word from the Lord was given in Singapore through someone, that Yolanda will be healed through the faith of her son. It didn’t take long before Yolanda miraculously awakened out of her coma and started to recover rapidly. She started to eat and drink again, sleep well again and became alert and sharp again. The

doctors were baffled at this sudden turn-around, especially as most of the people on Yolanda’s ward who were either kidney or heart patients had all died of the virus. Yolanda was the only one who recovered and was allowed to go home after her Corona test was negative. She reminded the doctors there, who were from another religion, that it was her Jesus who performed this miracle. The amazing thing is that some doctors ring her up when they have a kidney patient who wants to commit suicide (apparently that is quite common amongst kidney patients here) and ask Yolanda to please share her testimony with them to give them hope and encouragement. God obviously still has a lot of work to do for her here. Thank you to many of you who have been praying for her. Your prayers have been answered. We are all still praying for her to receive new kidneys.

While Yolanda was going through this whole ordeal, many of our children, youth and adults started to become ill with Corona symptoms as well. It spread like wild-fire and before we knew it well over one hundred were sick with the virus. We never got anyone tested as that would be futile and a waste of a lot of money since we knew from the symptoms what it was. Each patient rested in their home on the property and were looked after by everyone. No-one was put in isolation, we just let the virus follow its course while we all got on with

living. Some patients took two days to recover, some 4 days and some 2 weeks but everyone recovered, praise the Lord. Thank you once again for everyone who has been praying for all of our sick. You are a blessing.

Reaching out to the needy:

Although the Corona virus has stopped a lot of caring for the poor in the nation, we

have continued to reach out to as many people as possible in the region, providing some with food supplies, others with medical treatment while others with funds to be able to pay for hospital bills, transportation or equipment. The need is immense and everywhere. Our teams go out each week to




Our Seki (left photo) when he arrived in our village. He is 13 years old but looks like 8 or 9 due to mal-nourishment. He has advanced tuberculosis which he now receives treatment for. It is difficult to understand why his village waited so long before doing something about his condition but this is what often happens when people don't value life as much. He is very fragile and weak (right photo) but recovering. We are grateful to the Lord for bringing him here.



For people who are desperately hungry, there is no better way for us to show God's love to them than to help to provide for their physical needs. As we work to bring wholeness to people's lives, we must never ignore the fact that all of us have both physical and spiritual needs. It is impossible to minister effectively to the spiritual need without considering the physical need.

We work hard to keep our outward appearance attractive, but what is deep down in our heart (where others can't see) is more important to God. What are you like inside? When people become Christians, God makes them different on the inside. He will continue the process of change inside them if they only ask. God wants us to have healthy thoughts and motives, not just healthy bodies.



LWV Family News:

There has been a lot of growing and stretching in our huge family during the last many months. Many new children have arrived in our village from remote regions where families and communities were plunged into extreme poverty due to the sudden closure of rubber and palm oil plantations as a result of the pandemic. For many of these families it was already a challenge to survive before the pandemic and now even more so. Often during extremely difficult times, children are abandoned and we are grateful that at least someone cared enough to bring them to our village. Our hearts go out though to those children that didn't have someone to bring them here to our village. Our prayer is always that the Lord will help us find them or that He will have someone bring them to us. Every child is created in the image of God and He has a wonderful plan and purpose for them all, obviously not to be abandoned, sold, abused, but to make something beautiful of their lives. Someone, therefore has to give them that opportunity and we are ever so grateful to the Lord that He has created such a village as ours, in the middle of nowhere in this jungle, where children and youth can have the opportunity to be brought up in a safe place, by loving people, be educated and become whatever they want to become and at the same time learn to walk with Jesus every day. A huge thank you to all of you who sponsor one or more of our children/youth giving them that opportunity in life.

We have had a few wonderful weddings again. Our Yosef & Elisabet (right Photo) were married on June 20th here in our village. It was a fabulous wedding and both looked fantastic. They both were eleven years old when they arrived here in our village and fell in love with each other when they were still teenagers. It's so wonderful to see them together now as one and serving the Lord with all their heart. Yosef has studied law and is helping us now with all the legal papers and documents required when land is purchased. A lot of mediating goes on between many parties making sure the land will be secure. Yosef has also learnt to be a mechanic here and helps out at times in our workshop. Elisabet is a secondary school teacher and does a great job with that. She takes her calling as a teacher very seriously, which is great.



Our Hesi and Musa (left photo) were married on July 4th in Hesi's village. Only a few of our people could go to her village to celebrate with them. They had a wonderful time as well. She was 15 when she arrived in our village. She met Musa while she was doing her tertiary studies in Java. They are a great couple and are a wonderful example to our young people. Hesi is a teacher at our high school and Musa does a fantastic job repairing our washing machines, fridges and other machinery as well as being a driver when needed.

Building Progress:

An enormous amount of work has yet again been accomplished over the past few months which is extraordinary, considering that so many materials are hard to come by with stocks in almost every building sector depleted or just not available for whatever reason. And yet God has somehow again made it possible for us to receive building materials just at the right time and often in the most amazing ways. While others haven't been able to get materials our ordered supplies mostly kept on coming, albeit sometimes just at the last minute. Only a few times have we had to wait for some materials which wasn't a drama because we have so many projects going at the same time.





We began replacing the family quarters roof as well as the Training Centre outside undercover area, which is now one very large roof structure. It is a massive job requiring a lot of skills but our roof expert missionary, Daniel from Belgium, and his local team of our boys have done a fantastic job getting the trusses and roof covering up. Others have placed the ceilings and put all electrical cables in place. Scaffolding is starting to be dismantled and all of us just marvel at the structure which will no doubt last for many generations or until Jesus returns ☺. There is still quite a bit of ground work to be finalised around these two buildings which will take a few months to complete.



Yunus house (photo left) which used to be a 2 bedroom house, is being turned into an eight bedroom children's home. All the concreting has been done in the building and now scaffolding is being erected so that the roof trusses can be made. Once the house is finished it will house 15 children plus houseparents and their family. It doesn't look like much at the moment but it will be a fabulous and a blessed home once it is finished.

THE **HOLY** SPIRIT



Months of planning go into a wedding, the birth of a baby, a career change, a speaking engagement, the purchase of a home. Do you place the same importance on preparing for Christ's return, the most important event in your life? Its results will last for eternity. You dare not postpone your preparations because you do not know when His return will occur. The way to prepare is to study God's Word and live by its instructions each day. Only then will you be ready.



Ezra house and Nehemiah house (left photo) which are two houses under one roof, are almost finished with only a few touch-ups to be done and then they will be ready for children and houseparents to move into. These two houses are right next door to the high school which will help the school with a bit of security during the evenings and in holidays.

David house and Jonathan house (right photo) are being tiled at the moment and it won't be too long before these two houses will be ready for more children and youth to move into. These two houses are also next door to the high school on the opposite side from Ezra & Nehemiah house.



The primary school renovations are a very slow process due to the urgency in completing accommodation buildings so that they are ready to house all these new children who have arrived. Slowly things are being completed, but it will be quite some time before the buildings are ready for use again.



Abraham house in Nanga-Pinoh (photo left) is coming along as well. It is a huge project for us requiring a lot of patience and hard work. It will be great once it is completed and we can help many families who come down from remote villages located upstream from the waterfalls. Many of these tribal people need a place to stay when they bring their sick loved ones to the local hospital here for treatment. It will be a great way to minister and share the Gospel message to them.

Please pray with us for the right houseparents to oversee and run this important ministry. The photo doesn't give you much of an impression of how much work has already gone into this place. Here you can see that we are building a massive open drain which will be built all around the property to get rid of the huge volumes of water that normally engulf the property after tropical downpours. Why the drain first and not finish the house first? The house needs an underground water tank for house usage. The town doesn't have adequate town water hence people have to find their own water supply hence the need of a huge water tank, but before we can build that we need to level the land and before levelling the land we need to build the drains.

Titus house (photo right) is finally finished and what an incredible home it turned out to be. Danang & Tuti are house parents together with their three children. They have another 25 children/youth living with them as well as the mother of one of our children, who had a stroke last year and can't look after herself. We decided to bring her to our village so we can care for her as well. She just recently moved to Titus house. There is a wonderful homely, loving atmosphere in this home as well, which is mainly due to the way Danang and Tuti treat everyone and teach them how to love the Lord and how to respect and love each other.



If you sometimes doubt your salvation, the forgiveness of your sins, or God's work in your life, look at the evidence in Scripture and the changes in your life. When you doubt, don't turn away from Christ; turn to Him.



Our Riki & Novi, together with their three children are house parents now of Yefta house. They have another eight children/youth to look after and do a great job of it. Their home is also homely and loving. When God is central in our lives then His Presence is tangible making any place a great place. We are greatly blessed and very proud of all our house parents who all do an awesome job.

We have managed to build a few more kilometers of roads through our jungle in the area we haven't really surveyed before. We are trying to link certain roads with each other

so that access to key areas will be made easier. Of course this is easier said than done. Some hills are so steep and some valleys are so muddy that it is hard to make a road in those places without having to spend a fortune first. The reason we make these roads is so that tribal people don't come and pitch their tents on our property without us knowing about it. Once they have pitched their tents and made a vegetable garden or rice paddy they can, by law, eventually lay claim to a piece of land even though we bought it. Land claims can be very dicey here. We have learnt over the years what strange traditions and unfair laws to look out for and avoid.



We have also concreted another section of road next to Benjamin's house, which takes us to a T-intersection. (See below) This is a very steep hill and a huge job. On one side of this road we managed to cut out a large enough area to put another childrens home. We have already finished building the retaining walls and the septic tank for this house.



Christ can make a difference when it seems too late for anyone else to help. He can bring healing to broken relationships, release from addicting habits, and forgiveness and healing to emotional scars. If your situation looks hopeless, remember that Christ can do the impossible.

Broken relationships can hinder our relationship with God. If we have a problem or grievance with a friend, we should resolve the problem as soon as possible. We are hypocrites if we claim to love God while we hate others. Our attitudes toward others reflect our relationship with God.

Living Waters Village Orchards:

Our village has quite a few wonderful fruit orchards now producing some fantastic crops of various types of bananas, pineapples, papayas, wild mangos, rambutans (a bit like a lychee), jackfruit and we even have a few smelly durian trees. We have also hundreds of mangosteen (mangis) trees but they still haven't produced any fruit as yet. Usually takes 7- 10 years before they produce anything. Each childrens home have their own vegetable garden and orchard which they look after. Some are bigger than others, depending on how many children and youth live in a house but all do a marvellous job and enjoy eating the spoils. It's a great way of teaching them important life skills. A lot of children already have quite a bit of knowledge in gardening but their tribal traditional way, which is not always very productive, but it's a good start.

Our village has a large workshop where a lot of maintenance gets done. Each year it gets bigger as the village grows and as a result more equipment and machinery are required. Our workshop team has a number of sub teams who repair and service motorbikes, cars, trucks, generators, pumps and all sorts of machinery. Our workshop guys are all still quite young but they do an incredible job keeping things in good working condition. Some of them have had some wonderful training over the years by some missionaries. Some people think that missions work is preaching, worshipping or teaching Gods Word but missions is much more than that. It's using any skill or talent you have been entrusted to by the Lord, to serve Him, to

enlarge His Kingdom, helping the lost find Jesus. And you can do this by helping to build something, repair something, teach or just help at schools, nurse the sick, help with administrative work and the list is endless. Over the years many missionaries have come and gone here and all have made extremely valuable contributions to the people here by passing on their talents to our young people which they use now to carry on the Lord's work, contributing to reaching the lost. How awesome is that!



Living Waters Village Bible College:

On the 11th August finally our Bible College was officially opened, although perhaps not quite officially because we still haven't got all the required documents and Government approvals to register it properly, but that often takes years here. Schools and Bible Colleges usually just start and eventually the official Government registration arrives years later. We were blessed to be able to start with 20 students. Fourteen of them were from our village here and the rest from around the region. Our main aim is to raise-up and equip many pastors and church planters, preparing them to serve the Lord and live in remote regions where there is little or no Christian witness at all. There are still so many tribes and villages in Borneo to be reached with the Gospel message of unconditional love and forgiveness of sin and guilt.

To have our own Bible College means that we no longer need to send our students to various Bible Colleges in the country, saving us a lot of money which we can instead invest in church planting in the remote regions in these vast wild jungles. Our focus is, and always has been and always will be, to reach the lost, to help people find and receive Christ Jesus. Our main focus is not to build buildings, schools, start feeding programs etc, even though they are extremely important. Of course we do build them and start various programs to help the poor because you cannot point a starving child the way to Jesus without feeding them. You cannot point an abandoned, abused youth the way to Christ without providing a loving and safe place for them to live in. The two go hand in hand. Hence, we continue to build Living Waters Village, to help the many needy children and youth. At the same time we are constantly reaching out in the interior of Borneo to as many souls as possible, showing them the way to Christ Jesus. What a privilege and joy to be part of that.
