
When God created, He made something from nothing. Because we are created beings, we have no basis for pride. We exist only because God made us, and we have special gifts only because God gave them to us. Often, we run into people who are looking for God among the dead. They study the Bible as a mere historical document and go to church as if going to a memorial service. But Jesus is not among the dead, He lives! He reigns in the hearts of Christians, and He is the head of His church. Do you look for Jesus among the living? That doesn't mean they become perfect overnight but as they surrender to the Lord the Holy Spirit helps them to change every day a little bit, as they obey the Word of God and long to be more like Him, just like He does with all of us who put our trust in Him. It's a life-long process with all its ups and downs, obstacles, challenges, mountain top, valley and desert experiences that helps our faith to mature and become strong and

invincible. It's an incredible privilege for us missionaries and leaders here to be there for our children and young people to help them with this life changing challenge. I can't thank God enough for bringing them to our village so that they receive the opportunity to learn to walk and talk with God each day.


Our Aldo, Fajar & Gibran. Amongst the new children that arrived this year are our Aldo, Fajar and Gibran. All siblings from the same mother, but different fathers who are all from a different religion than ours. They don't even know who their biological parents are as their parents never cared for them or wanted them. All three were adopted by a family that had no children themselves. However, a few years after they were adopted, their adoptive parents had their own biological children, and their affection began to fade towards these three adopted siblings. The adopted father forced these boys who were just 7, 5 and 3 years old to work all day going through the jungle, looking for vegetables and fruit to sell to other people. What's more, these little brothers were only provided one meal a day. All other meals they had to find themselves! Eventually, their adoptive father heard about Living Waters Village, and travelled three days to bring these boys to our place, since he didn't want them anymore. So hard to believe that people can be so heartless but I do thank the adoptive father for at least bringing them to us and not dumping them somewhere in the forest like some are in the habit of doing.

These young boys did not receive any love what-so-ever from their biological parents, nor from their adoptive parents, but when they came to Living Waters Village they were immediately welcomed into our super large family and loved to bits. The boys very quickly learnt for the first time in their lives what love is through the way all of us just cared and fussed over them and all three boys embraced it thoroughly. They just glowed with excitement and craved for this new found love they were experiencing. They quickly learnt that they too can love and treat people like everyone seems to do in our village because of this



Jesus we believe in. Aldo, who is the oldest, absolutely loves to help everyone. He constantly looks for ways to help people during meal times, dishing up, providing extra chairs for unexpected guests, high-chairs for babies and all without even being asked! How amazing that these boys who never experienced love, care and compassion from their own families, can now through a short time of examples they have learnt here, show it now towards others. But that's how God works in the lives of the children here. No matter what darkness they have previously experienced in their lives, He gives them hope, joy and a heart for others that can only come from an all-powerful and wonderful God.

The world sees power as a way to gain control over others. But Jesus, with all authority and power in heaven and earth, chose to serve others. He held children in His arms, healed the sick, washed the disciples' feet, and died for the sins of the world. Jesus' followers today receive this same power to serve. As believers, we are called to be servants of Christ. As Christ served, we are to serve.



At the end of this school year in June a number of our youth who have finished junior or senior high school have chosen to leave our village, usually through the insistence of some of their family members or because of their own choice. Some end up going back to their village and some go to find a job and try to make it on their own. Thankfully we usually keep contact with most of them and are happy to hear that a lot of them stay close to the Lord but some unfortunately do take a wrong turn and end up in all sorts of terrible situations. They know they can always turn to us and we always try to help them out and show them again that God's path for them is far better and greater than what the world has to offer. Unfortunately, some people seem to have to

learn it the hard way.



Since December we have had 79 new children and youth arrive in our village. Some of them don't even speak any Indonesian but only their tribal language however within a short span of time they learn to speak Indonesian. Some of them arrive not knowing any social skills at all and as a result they have some dreadful behavioural problems. It seems that no one has ever taught them anything, but


as we teach them social skills in our village, some have an incredible hard time in adjusting, but through our perseverance, love, persistence and a lot of prayer they eventually make it and then thoroughly enjoy their new way of life amongst people from so many different tribes and cultures. It is hard work, to say the least, but very rewarding to see them eventually enjoy and care for each other. I Can't thank the Lord enough for our





OUR FLORA:

Our little Flora (9 years old) arrived in our village with a heart disorder. After a number of medical examinations, it was determined that she urgently needed heart surgery or risk her life being snatched from her at a very young age. Usually, we go to Malaysia for any major surgeries but in this case, we decided to take her to a private heart hospital in Jakarta. The cost was enormous but as we asked the Lord He somehow again provided in a miraculous way. The surgery was delayed several times but eventually the green light was given and the surgery proceeded and was very successful, praise the Lord.

Flora was a very brave little girl and handled it all just amazingly. She knew that God was with her and that many people were praying for her. Now back at our village (photo left) she is doing just great and if you didn't know

that she just recently had major heart surgery you would think she was just like any other healthy child, which in many ways she is now. Flora's mother died last year and her dad is dying with a tumour on his spine. We have been helping him as well but the doctors cannot do anything anymore for him. All the while we have been praying for the Lord to do a wonderful miracle in his life and we are still believing for that. Flora's father is being looked after by Flora's older sister in their village. Her older brother Dilo lives also here in our village. He will be attending our Bible College this year.

TRAINING SEMINARS:

We have enjoyed a lot of training seminars in the last few months. A great team from Jakarta came over to train our Children's Church teachers with new, creative skills for the various age groups. The training took a whole week and a lot was learnt. Fantastic to see how enthusiastic our young teachers were to want to improve their skills so as to make our children's church more enjoyable and informative so that our children grow in Bible knowledge and learn through it all how to have a personal relationship with God.

The team from Jakarta who have done an incredible job teaching the whole week our Children's Church (Sunday School) teachers valuable creative teaching skills.

The 4Square farming team teaching some of our church-planters a valuable way how to live off a small plot of land producing enough food for a family of four.



We also had a great team come over from Singapore and Cambodia to train our church planters about 4Square farming which is a technique to help families in remote villages to be able to live of farming on just a small plot of land 14 x 14 meters. This technique provides a fish pond, quail coop, fruit trees and vegetable garden all on this small plot of land. It feeds a family of 4 without having to buy anything else. The team also taught our guys hands on training how to make microorganism solution and organic pest control. It was a very valuable hands-on-training for our guys. They all went back to their villages enriched and will be using this tool to help the poor in the remote regions but also to use it as a tool to introduce the Gospel to people who have never heard yet. A huge thank you to the team that made this possible.


All these teams have come over and used their own resources and time to come and bless our ministry. We are immensely grateful for the sacrifices they have made to help us.

Through the "Kids Reach Team" that come each year to train our people, a team of our own people has been set up called KKS (Kids Keep Safe). They focus on helping our children how to stay safe, teaching them what is permitted and what is not permitted in regards to their bodies and personal boundaries. Many of our children have been sexually abused in their villages and some don't even realise that it's not normal behaviour. Our KKS team do an incredible task in creating discussions with our children in small groups so that they can talk about things that have happened to them in their



village and learn how to deal with it. Our team pray for the children, use Bible verses to teach our children how to trust Jesus and His Word, what is permissible and what is not, how to guard themselves from predators, and how to report anything suspicious to this team or leaders. We are so blessed to have such a dedicated team in our village and to see the incredible success they are seeing amongst so many of our children who have been affected like this amongst their tribe. Please pray with us that more and more children and youth will open up their awful experiences to our KKS team so that they can be set free from such a horrific past.

The end result of the Holy Spirit's work in our lives is deep and lasting peace. Unlike worldly peace, which is usually defined as the absence of conflict, this peace is confident assurance in any circumstance; with Christ's peace, we have no need to fear the present or the future. Sin, fear, uncertainty, doubt, and numerous other forces are at war within us. The peace of God moves into our hearts and lives to restrain these hostile forces and offer comfort in place of conflict. Jesus says He will give us that peace if we are willing to accept it from Him. If your life is full of stress, allow the Holy Spirit to fill you with Christ's peace.






A fantastic time of Fellowship with our church-planters and Bible College students.






If you are letting a desire for recognition, craving for power, or love of money rule your life, you may find yourself besieged by enemies like stress, anxiety, illness, fatigue. Keep God at the centre of your life, and you will have the power you need to fight these destroyers.



Hypocrisy is knowing the truth but not obeying it. People can say they follow Jesus, but not be obedient to His Word.
Hypocrisy is living a self-serving life. People may desire leadership only because they love position and control, not because they want to serve others. Hypocrisy reduces faith to rigid rules. People can end up worshipping their own rules and regulations about what they think God wants instead of worshipping God himself. Hypocrisy is outward conformity without inner reality. People can obey the details but still be disobedient in general behaviour. For example, a person may carefully tithe his income, but be rude and obnoxious to his coworkers.

Building Progress:

We have been rather busy with our building projects. A number of buildings have been finished and a number of new ones started. Three more children's homes have been completed. Two of them, GAD home and ASHER home, are already in use. Our house parents illintria & Prengky live in Gad home with 13 children and our house parents Elto & Tini live in Asher home with 13 children and both house parents are doing a fantastic job. Naftali home is also finished but we are still waiting contemplating who we should have as house parents there. We always want to make sure we have the right house parents with the right children and youth.



Yehuda home and Simeon home are still a few months away from being finished. The complex infra structure around these houses require a lot more planning and expertise as both houses are surrounded by underground septic tanks, colossal underground rainwater tanks, steep descents and more. Hence a lot more careful planning and construction so that we don't end up with major issues in years to come.





We have started with building the 2 km road from Benjamin's home to our high schools. We always concrete our roads as they are then much stronger with hardly any maintenance and will last forever. This road is urgent as we want to start with building our Bible College. Our Bible College is currently operational in


our High School but the school will be needing the class rooms soon hence we need to rush with organizing building the road

and other infra structure first and then start with the actual buildings. This is not normal practice here in Indonesia. Custom here is to first build the building and then gradually build the infra structure around it but that turns always into a nightmare. Not a practice I want follow. We have levelled the top of one of our hills for our Bible College project and have started with preparing on site all the building materials for all the massive drains, retaining walls, land erosion prevention and more. A lot of planning and preparation is required for rainfalls of 6-10 meters each year. We don't want our buildings to end up sliding down the hill which does happen here on the island in various places.

The church's mission - to send the gospel to all the world – is fraught with overwhelming obstacles. Any one of them appears devastating. Against human stubbornness, disease, danger, terrorism, loneliness, sin, greed, and even church strife and corruption, what can a few missionaries hope to accomplish? Yet we go out with love and gratitude for Jesus and leave the big obstacles to God.









The foundation of the church (of all believers) is Jesus Christ. Nothing and no one else will do. A building with no foundation, or one poorly constructed, will not last. The finest materials used to construct a home quickly rot and fall apart if they are resting on the ground. And a building is only as solid as its foundation. The foundation of our life is Jesus Christ; He is our base, our reason for being. Everything we are and do must fit into the pattern provided by Him. Are you building your life on the only and real lasting foundation, or are you building on a faulty foundation, such as wealth, security, success, or fame? Be careful how you build.

Because our Primary School is growing and running out of room, we have had to resort to cutting into another hill and make room for another building which will have 6 class rooms. We have decided for a one level building so that it can be completed quicker. Retaining walls are going up as we speak, and soon we will be able to start on the foundations. We hope to have it finished for next year's school intake. We would appreciate your prayers for this too.

Our High School is undergoing a massive construction. According to the education

department we are required to have a number of sporting facilities which we thought we already had, such as a soccer field, volley ball court in two locations on the property and a river to swim in but apparently that is not adequate. Ironic really as 40% of children in Kalimantan still can't go to school because there are no schools for them. Hence, if I was them, I would focus on that rather than on sporting facilities but we notice that as our ministry gets bigger more demands are put on us by all sorts of government departments. We can stall these projects or even refuse because we don't receive any

government funding what-so-ever, and we want to keep it that way, but we also don't want to deprive our students from a good education which includes sports. Hence, we have embarked on building a futsal court, basketball court and two volley ball courts. We are also building undercover parking area's as well as a large undercover area in the courtyard between the major buildings.

Near the training centre the massive new facilities building for our sewing room, storage rooms, shop, parking area's and 13 houses is coming along great. While I was away a number of our young people, full timers and workers we employ from outside had to pour cement for the second floor of one of the buildings which took them 27 hours non-stop. Various teams in various areas were organized for this mammoth task. Although it was a difficult job, they all seemed to still have fun doing it and did a fantastic job.

LWV PIGGERY:

We have finally been able to start with setting up a piggery. Years ago, with much persuasion our guys were allowed from me to start a small piggery. Knowing how the locals don't look after the wellbeing of animals very well I allowed them to have a few pigs. The deal was that if they proved to me that they could look after a few pigs well by feeding them the right food and not plastic and other non-edible waste and keep up with clean water daily and clean their pens then I may let them increase the number of pigs they can

have. But unfortunately, it didn't last long. It was obvious they didn't care one bit about the wellbeing of the pigs hence we closed it down. We ate the pigs and stopped having a piggery. Now years later with many of



our young people who remember what happened before, are now much older and wiser and were ready for a new start up knowing full well how I expect them to look after the wellbeing of animals. They were actually stunned when I read to them a verse in scripture Proverbs 12:10a where it says "the godly care for their animals". Hence now our piggery looks great and well maintained which is a credit to them. Now we will have pork a bit more often which the Dayak people just absolutely love almost as much as the Durian fruit. The real reason we have actually started a piggery is a little sensitive so do ask me when you see me and I may let you know \bigcirc .



No matter where we are in our spiritual journey, no matter how mature we are in our faith, the sinful world will always challenge our faith. We still have much room for growth. Every day we need to draw closer to Christ so that we will be prepared to stand for truth in any and all circumstances.

Praise Points:

- For Flora's successful heart operation.
- For the safe arrival of all the babies in the past few months and the health of them and their mums.
- We thank the Lord for two new pieces of land that we have been able to purchase so far this year. One plot is 7 hectares (17 Acres) and the other is 0.8 hectares (2 acres). See the bright green areas on the map layout. Both plots have been very difficult to purchase and taken years in negotiations but through persistent prayer the Lord has finally answered. A huge thank you to everyone who have prayed with us and who have contributed funds for us to be able to purchase them finally. We still have quite a few plots to purchase so please do not give up on praying for those.



- We praise and thank the Lord for the increase in springs we have found on our land. Currently we have 9 springs which are providing us **each day** with more than 1 million litres (264,550 gallons) of clean, pure, fresh water. Again, such a miracle and blessing from the Lord.
- For the wonderful 5 weeks in Australia spending time with my Kay, our children and grandchildren as well as minister in various churches.
- For the wonderful new passenger bus truck and two pickup trucks. What a wonderful gift these are. We have been praying for them for quite some time and can't thank God enough for them. One pickup truck will be used for fuel transport to our generators each day and the other will be used for daily rubbish (trash) collection. Thank you immensely to all those people who have contributed financially to these important vehicles.
- For the two new incredible 200-kilowatt DENYO generators which have been entirely made and assembled in Japan. The two fabulous machines have been positioned at the training centre area as most of our electricity is required there. The two DENYO 125 KVA generators that were positioned at the TC have now been moved to our schools and surrounding houses area. Two more DENYO generators are on order and should arrive in the next month or so which will be placed at the workshop area. All four magnificent machines are an incredible gift from a wonderful family in Holland. A huge thank you to them from everyone here.
- For the wonderful gift of 7 new motorbikes. 5 motorbikes are for several of our church planters and 2 motorbikes are for ministry use in our village. Funds for these bikes come from various individuals and groups. A massive thank you to you all who contributed to this.
